






RECIPES FOR OLD FRIENDS







This recipe makes a food that looks a lot like canned pumpkin or canned dog food, and it's so good for your pup. It's a great place to hide medicines, and the Old Friends gang just loves it! Each dog gets a big spoonful on top of their kibble.

INGREDIENTS

(These amounts don't have to be exact.)

2 pounds boneless chicken breasts and thighs

1 pound whiting fish or catfish

1/4 pound chicken livers and/or gizzards

1/2 pound carrots

1 (12-ounce) box frozen green beans

1/2 cup canned pumpkin

1 apple

1 small sweet potato, cut into large chunks

1/2 cup plain yogurt

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup psyllium fiber (with no artificial sweeteners)

a heaping tablespoon of coconut oil

1 tablespoon turmeric

STEPS

- Add the chicken, fish, livers or gizzards, carrots, beans, pumpkin, apple, and sweet potato to a Crock-Pot and cook on low for 12 hours or more. Spoon into a blender or food processor, and blend until smooth. (You may have to do this in batches.)
- 2. Place in a large bowl.
- Then add yogurt, psyllium fiber, coconut oil, and turmeric. Mix well.

Use within 4 to 5 days. It can also be frozen.

Dried Sweet Potato Chews

Dogs love these sweet and chewy treats.

INGREDIENTS

2–3 large sweet potatoes, washed thoroughly and dried

STEPS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 250° F. Line two baking sheets with parchment paper.
- 2. With a grown-up's help, cut a thin piece of the sweet potato off one of the long edges. (This will help it lie flat while you cut it into slices.)
- 3. Slice the rest of the potato into thin "chips" that are at least 1/4-inch thick. Spread the potato slices on the baking sheets.
- 4. Bake for 90 minutes. Turn the pieces over and bake for 90 more minutes. This will give you a soft, chewy treat. If your dog likes crunchier chews, bake for 20–30 minutes more. (When you first take the potatoes out of the oven, they may still seem soft. They will dry and harden as they cool.)

Store in the refrigerator for up to 3 weeks, or freeze.



INGREDIENTS

1 cup ground dry dog food kibble 2 cups baking mix 1 (18.8-ounce) can chunky chicken soup

STEPS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350° F.
- 2. Grind kibble in a food processor or blender until it looks like a coarse flour. Grind enough kibble to get 1 cup of "kibble flour."
- 3. Stir the ground kibble, baking mix, and soup together until well mixed. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto greased cookie sheets. Bake for 15 minutes or until golden brown.

Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator. Makes about 50 to 60 bite-sized treats.



INGREDIENTS

- 32 ounces vanilla yogurt
- 1 large mashed banana
- 2 tablespoons peanut butter
- 2 tablespoons honey

STEPS

- Add all ingredients to a blender or food processor. Blend until smooth.
- 2. Pour into an ice cube tray and freeze.

Serve frozen, or let them soften for 10 minutes.
