










**FEET ON THE TABLE**, pillows spread around—this room was created to be lived in.




THIS HUTCH started out black. I painted over it and then made a book page garland for a temporary party decoration.

Dried out stumps from the yard, used as tables








The good news is you can have a big impact on each of these objections if you have a little patience.

My office consists of a seventy-five-dollar yard-sale armoire (a Spanish wood Rooms to Go piece that everyone in America has had at some point, painted with Behr paint plus primer); an eighty-five-dollar dresser that I took a door off of, put baskets in, and painted the same as the armoire; a fifteen-dollar yard-sale kitchen table; and an upholstered chair I've had for years. None of it came from an office-supply store, and each piece can be used in a different way in a different room if the need arises.












TOP A two-foot-tall owl that I found in a thrift store for ten dollars and spray-painted white. He went from creepy 1970s to glossy and on-trend.
