"nothing against queer people"



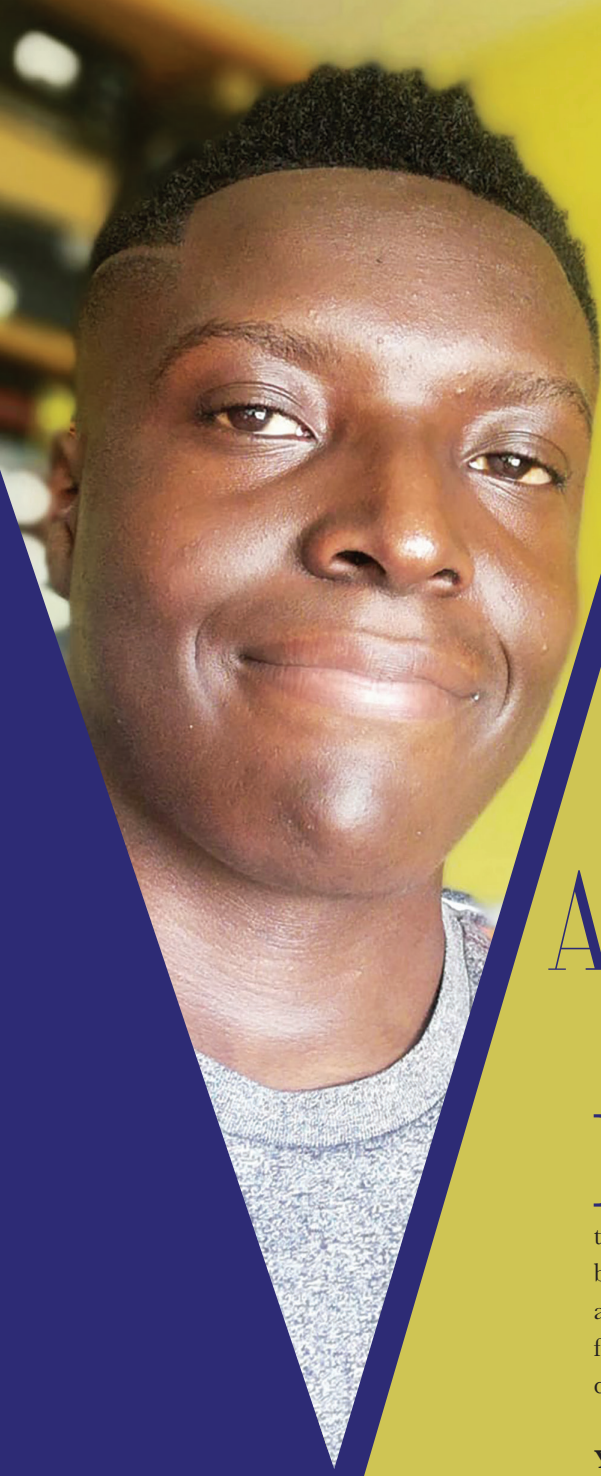
