Jewish communities throughout the Roman Empire

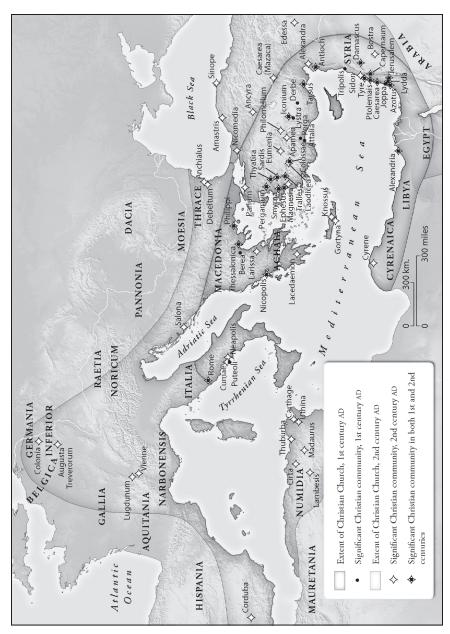

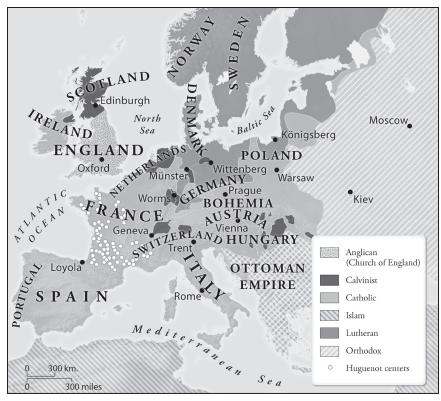

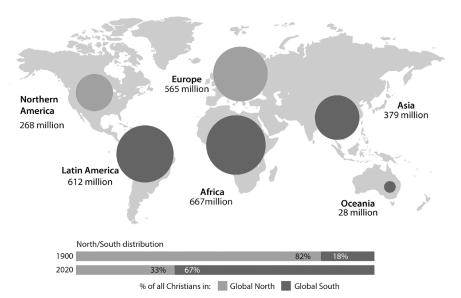
