- 2. Gideon felt insignificant and couldn't understand how God could use him, but he said yes to God's invitation and plan. Do you ever feel insignificant and unworthy of a role in God's kingdom? What has God said about your worth and your significance?
- 3. John the Baptist lived very simply in order to fulfill God's plan for him. Have you ever intentionally simplified your lifestyle in order to free up more time or resources for God's purposes?
- 4. Like Peter, you are in process and will make some mistakes. Have you invited God into your days and

- asked Him to fill you with His Holy Spirit? Are you intentionally stretching your spiritual muscles and learning what it means to be used by Him?
